Follow-up from March Forum with Letrice Grant of the Baltimore Peace Movement

Gunpowder Friends warmly welcomed Letrice Gant, one of the founding organizers of the Baltimore Peace Movement (formerly, Baltimore Ceasefire), to lead our February forum. Letrice Gant addressed the early history of the Ceasefire movement, which began holding quarterly citywide ceasefires in May 2017, and its evolution into The Baltimore Peace Movement. In the lively discussion that followed, Ms. Gant offered ideas and inspiration for Friends to engage now with this self-actualizing peace movement. She added that Baltimore has now seen a 20% drop in homicides year over year from 2023, and yet the work is not complete.
